Sheriffs Report – Clint Johnson – 453-2049

December 2003 Case report for Granite West District was provided by the Sheriff’s Office and reviewed by the Council. Relatively quiet month: Only 2 vehicle burglaries (District 5), 1 drug-related offense, and 5 suspicious circumstances.

**3) Council Business 7:15**

- a) Minutes for September, meeting. Alan Buchanan, GCC Secretary.

No GCC Meeting was held in December. The minutes from the November meeting were posted on the GCC web site.

- b) Treasurer's Report & ACT report. Todd Young, GCC Chair / Treasurer.

Year-end accounting of 2003 GCC indicate revenues from SLCO, private donations, and account interest of \$1747.63. Expenditures for ACCT dues & Website construction of \$1525.00. FY2002 carry-over of \$1311.42+revenues-expenditures= \$1587.64.

- c) Granite Community Council’s website flyer.

An example of a GCC website flyer was distributed in the meeting. District 5 Representatives K. Crockett & S. Vogler distributed flyers in their district last November.

- d) IHC Arbitration Agreement

Concerned community members have voiced their opposition to the IHC mandatory arbitration agreement. The agreements appear to force patients to either give up their legal rights to a full judicial review or give up their medical coverage. A group called

e) Cottonwood Heights Incorporation.

Cottonwood Heights Township is moving ahead with plans for Incorporation, and may involve annexing GCC area. It was moved & seconded that in addition to inviting Cottonwood Heights to make the ‘pitch’ to GCC, that Salt Lake County, Sandy, and “none” be included as potential annexing entities. It was also mentioned that Little Cottonwood Creek Community Council (LCCCC) should also be contacted. The motion carried unanimously.

f) ACCT Report/ Phone Tree.

Citizen lobbyists are needed by ACCT to help support grassroots legislation with the legislature. It provides great experience with the lawmaking process, and as private citizens avoids registration and fee issues face by professional lobbyists. A phone tree is needed to disseminate information quickly and efficiently to our constituents. K. Crockett & S. Mortensen were interested in providing help.

g) Water Fluoridation Issue.

An opinion piece against municipal water fluoridation by Marc D. Flack, DDS was distributed to members of the GCC. The council had an interesting discussion of the pros and cons of the topic.

h) Items needed for orphanage.

K. Crockett distributed a list of much needed day-to-day items for an orphanage in Roatan. Kris is leaving Jan. 27, 2004, and welcomes any help with obtaining any of the items.
